Patrolman Patrick Nolan was exonerated by the board of police commissioners on charges of grafting when Sergeants Monahan and Meiers and seven policemen were dismissed from the force. He formerly walked in the "bad lands."

Patrolman Sicking is one of the strongest men on the force. Several years ago he captured five burglars in the downtown district single-handed. He has been walking in the vicinity of Clark avenue, Broadway and Seventh street.

A general shifting around of policemen in the central district, it is stated, will result from the shake-up.
