Michael Roemer Gets Off Easy on His
Manslaughter Case.

A Manslaughterer's Sentence Commuted.

Michael Roemer was charged with having killed William B. Sickling on the 11th of December, 1877, by cutting him with a knife. The evidence was heard and he was convicted of manslaughter in the third degree, and sentenced to pay a fine of \$100 and be imprisoned in the city jail for three months on March 3d of this year. A motion for a new trial was filed, and after various continuances the case came up in the Criminal Court to-day. The motion was overruled, but the punishment was commuted to a fine of \$500.
